

Open Profiles

Anyone with an ORCiD can use OpenVIVO

Attribution

OpenVIVO extends the CRediT taxonomy and supports multiple attribution for each work, recognizing each contributor, beyond authorship, using a new controlled vocabulary of 58 terms

FAIR² Data

All data meets FAIR principles + Recognition (FAIR²) and is published every day to http://openvivo.org/data

ORCID Login

No new password to learn

Open Ontologies

All OpenVIVO ontologies are open. The VIVO-ISF, supported by OpenRIF, the VIVO Project, and the FORCE11 Attribution WG, provides fundamental representation for scholarship

Automated Profiles

Each time you login, OpenVIVO will synch your works from ORCiD. You can add new works by DOI or PubMed ID. You can add attributions to any work.

Immediate Data Reuse

CTSAsearch harvests VIVO data every day, pooling it with other data to facilitate research discovery

FAST Terminology

OCLC terms used for identifying research areas

Standard Persistent Identifiers

ORCiD for people, DOI for works, GRID ID for organizations, ISSN for journals
